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RESUMO:

Introdução: A hipótese da autonomia da consciência em relação ao cérebro é um tema controverso sobre o qual há uma longa história de investigações científicas. Entretanto, ainda não se realizou uma análise sistematizada das publicações sobre esse tema, que possibilite conhecer o estado da arte nesse campo e determinar lacunas e limitações metodológicas.

Objetivos: Fazer um levantamento biométrico das publicações que investigaram experiências habitualmente associadas à possibilidade da existência da consciência independente do cérebro nas principais bases de dados científicos.

Métodos: Avaliaram-se todos os artigos contidos no Pubmed, Web of Knowledge, PsycINFO, Science Direct e Scopus até 31/12/2015, através de operadores booleanos, envolvendo os seguintes campos: Experiências de quase morte(NDE), Experiências fora do corpo(OBE), Experiências de final de vida(ELE), Possessão(POS), Memórias sugestivas de vidas passadas(PLM), Mediunidade(MED), transcomunicação, detecção de “espíritos” e relação mente-cérebro. Foram excluídos artigos científicos fora do tema ou de outras áreas, publicações não científicas, referências de livros e capítulos de livros.

Resultados: Dos 9065 artigos encontrados, 1954 artigos foram incluídos (598 NDE, 223 OBE, 56 ELE, 224 POS, 244 PLM, 565 MED, 44 outros). Ao longo das décadas, notou-se um aumento na quantidade de artigos em todos os campos avaliados, com exceção dos estudos em Mediunidade, no qual houve um declínio no final do sec XX e uma retomada no sec XXI. Em

relação aos tipos de artigos, com exceção de Past-life memories e End-of-life experiences (predominando estudos originais), os demais campos possuíram predomínio de artigos de revisão. Os artigos foram publicados em periódicos com fator de impacto médio comparável com outras áreas da ciência, como por exemplo psicologia positiva e reabilitação cardiovascular.

Conclusão: De forma geral as pesquisas sobre sobrevivência da consciência têm aumentado nas últimas décadas, em revistas com fator de impacto semelhante ao de outras áreas, porém com predomínio de revisões. A identificação dessas lacunas pode auxiliar na elaboração de novas pesquisas na área.

ABSTRACT

Introduction: The hypothesis of autonomy of the consciousness in relation to the brain is a controversial subject with a long history of scientific investigations. To date, however, no systematic analysis of the publications on this topic, establishing the state of art in this field and identifying methodological gaps and limitations, has been conducted.

Objectives: To conduct a bibliometric search of publications investigating experiences commonly associated with the possibility of the existence of a consciousness independent of the brain held on the main scientific databases.

Methods: A search of all articles held on the Pubmed, Web of Knowledge, PsycINFO, Science Direct and Scopus databases up to 31/12/2015 was performed with boolean operators involving the following fields: Near-death experiences (NDE), Out-of-body experiences (OBE), End-of-life experiences (ELE), Possession (POS), Memories suggestive of past lives (PLM), Mediumship (MED), transcommunication, detection of “spirits” and mind-brain relationship. Scientific articles unrelated to the topic or on other areas, unscientific publications, book references and book chapters were all excluded.

Results: Of the 9065 articles retrieved, 1954 were included (598 NDE, 223 OBE, 56 ELE, 224 POS, 244 PLM, 565 MED, 44 others). Over the decades, there was an evident increase in the number of articles on all the fields, with the exception of studies on Mediumship which showed a decline during the late twentieth century and subsequent rise in the early twenty-first century. Regarding the types of articles found, with the exception of Past-life memories

and End-of-life experiences (mostly original studies), publications were predominantly review articles. The articles were published in journals with an average impact factor similar to other areas of science, such as positive psychology and cardiovascular rehabilitation.

Conclusion: Overall, publications of studies on survival of the consciousness have tended to increase over recent decades in journals with similar impact factors to other areas, although these studies were predominantly review articles. Identifying gaps can help guide future studies in the area.

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1. Introdução:

1.1. Apresentação:

Como médico, a presença da morte na história do paciente parece completar o ciclo de uma doença. A estrutura da anamnese clássica é assentada sobre as bases investigativas que podem conduzir ao diagnóstico e tratamento (Benseñor, 2013), e permitir especulações sobre o prognóstico de uma doença. O conhecimento da doença e suas características em uma população inserem informações sobre a sobrevida do paciente e o enfrentamento de sua doença. A morte, por outro lado, é historicamente tida como a culminância do término da relação entre o médico e seu paciente(Vianna e Picelli, 1998; Macrae, 2001; Pazin-Filho, 2005).

Os estágios do morrer foram descritos há quase 40 anos, por Kubler-Ross(Kubler-Ross, 2002) e, ainda hoje, a integração do médico em todas as fases da morte do paciente é um desafio às especialidades médicas que tratam doentes crônicos(Smaldone e Uzzo, 2013). O processo do morrer pode ainda gerar especulações filosóficas e científicas sobre a autonomia da consciência em relação ao cérebro e consequente postulação de sua sobrevivência após a morte.

A imortalidade, ou sobrevivência após a morte, de modo geral aparece na literatura acadêmica como tema de domínio da Filosofia e das Ciências da Religião. Quando associado à Medicina, na maior parte das vezes, é evocado como ilustração histórica (Santos, 2007), onde os espíritos eram causadores das doenças (Scliar, 2007) , ou como ilustração alegórica (Arlow, 1982).

A possibilidade da autonomia da consciência em relação ao cérebro está presente como elemento cultural da humanidade, em todas as suas

épocas. As diversas tradições religiosas e filosóficas têm debatido há milênios se o ser humano é constituído apenas por seu corpo físico (materialismo filosófico) ou se possui uma mente/alma/espírito/consciência que transcenderia o corpo físico e que poderia sobreviver à morte (espiritualismo filosófico) (Araujo, 2013). Relatos e experiências transcendentais e espirituais, que envolvem estados alterados da consciência, têm implicações para a compreensão da relação mente-cérebro (Moreira-Almeida, A., 2013) e, desde meados do século XIX, pesquisadores têm buscado realizar investigações científicas sobre possíveis evidências da autonomia da consciência em relação ao cérebro (Hyslop, 1898; Alvarado, 2003; 2013b; Sommer, 2014).

Ian Stevenson (Stevenson, 1977b) propõe três períodos históricos distintos nessas investigações científicas: o primeiro (1880 – 1930) seria o período predominado pela coleta e análise das alegadas manifestações espontâneas de “personalidades já mortas”; o segundo (1930 – 1960) foi caracterizado pelas pesquisas da Parapsicologia, onde o foco predominante foi a análise de manifestações extra-sensórias tendo por agente pessoas vivas e o terceiro (a partir de 1960) caracterizou-se pelo retorno das experiências que poderiam gerar evidências sobre a sobrevivência após a morte.

Entretanto, esse tema sempre foi marcado por controvérsias no meio acadêmico (Moreira-Almeida, 2012; Cardeña, 2014). De um lado, os materialistas acreditam que a mente seria um processo material ou físico, um produto do funcionamento cerebral. De outro lado, de acordo com visões não materialistas, a mente seria algo diferente do cérebro, podendo existir além

dele (Stevenson, 1977b; Stevenson e Greyson, 1979; Saavedra-Aguilar e Gómez-Jeria, 1989; Almeder, 1992; Martens, 1994; Mobbs e Watt, 2011; Moreira-Almeida e Araujo, 2015).

Nesse contexto, nas últimas décadas houve um aumento do número de publicações acerca desse assunto (como por exemplo na área de experiências de quase morte) (Sleutjes *et al.*, 2014), associado a um interesse do público geral (Markovsky e Thye, 2001). Diversas linhas de pesquisas foram criadas em diferentes temas, como por exemplo, experiências de quase morte, experiências fora do corpo, mediunidade, experiências espirituais no leito de morte, memórias sugestivas de vidas passadas, dentre outras (Moreira-Almeida, A., 2013).

Compreender os tipos de estudos, principais temas, desenhos metodológicos, desfechos principais e a produção global dessas pesquisas é de grande importância para se conhecer o estado da arte no campo, determinar possíveis lacunas de investigação e limitações metodológicas, o que auxiliará a traçar futuras direções para esse campo de pesquisa. Porém, não identificamos na literatura um estudo que tenha traçado um panorama dos principais artigos sobre o tema por meio da consulta dos principais bancos de artigos científicos, permitindo uma compreensão abrangente desse campo.

Nas bases de dados eletrônicos de literatura científica, a temática da possibilidade da autonomia da consciência em relação ao cérebro pode ser encontrada em revistas científicas indexadas na forma de pesquisas com dados originais, relatos de casos, artigos de revisão.

Para que se possa traçar um panorama das pesquisas atuais é necessário fazer inicialmente um levantamento bibliométrico das publicações que investigaram experiências associadas a possibilidade da existência da autonomia da consciência em relação ao cérebro nas principais bases de dados científicos.

1.1.1. Panorama Histórico das postulações da autonomia da consciência em relação ao cérebro:

A crença que o corpo humano se constituía de órgãos animados por um componente etéreo, não material, se estabeleceu na Medicina dos povos ancestrais que povoaram todo o neolítico (3500 a.C.). A recorrência de achados de trepanação (procedimento cirúrgico que consiste em abrir orifícios na calota craniana para acesso às membranas que revestem o cérebro e também ao próprio órgão), permitiu que paleopatologistas especulassem que a principal indicação de tal procedimento fosse ritualístico, como forma de liberar os doentes da influência dos mal espíritos (Kelly, 2009).

Hipócrates de Cós estabeleceu os princípios da prática e da terapêutica médicas. A medicina hipocrática foi baseada em concepções capitais: vitalismo, humorismo e mecanicismo (Da Silva, 1933; Lonie, 1981). A doutrina vitalista de Hipócrates trata do pneuma, que, segundo a interpretação da doutrina hipocrática por alguns autores, desapareceria após a morte (Da Silva, 1933)

Influenciado por Hipócrates, Hierófilo descreve a *pneuma psíquica* como responsável pelo movimento e sensações do indivíduo e localiza no

quarto ventrículo cerebral a sede da alma(Castro e Landeira-Fernandez, 2011).

Galen, um dos médicos de maior influência em toda a história da Medicina, propagou a teoria dos *pneuma*, estabelecendo uma convicção que perdurou por cerca de mil e quinhentos anos, de componentes imateriais e intangíveis, vapores ou fluidos, responsáveis por ‘animar’ o ser humano (Barros, 2002).

Descartes (1596-1650) propôs em sua filosofia uma concepção do homem que envolvia também a fisiologia e aspectos metafísicos (Donatelli, 2003). Para Descartes, ao contrário dos animais, os homens são dotados de alma (Rocha, 2004), todavia o *spiritus animalis* de Descartes são corpúsculos materiais e a função da alma é a produção dos pensamentos (Descartes, 1989).

O século XVIII assistiu a emergência do mesmerismo, ou práticas iniciadas por Franz Anton Mesmer (1734-1815), que consistiam de técnicas que tinham por objetivo a correção do desequilíbrio do chamado “magnetismo animal” (Alvarado *et al.*, 2007).

O Moderno Espiritualismo, termo que designa toda a fenomenologia alegadamente mediúnica e ostensivamente desenvolvida na segunda metade do século XIX (Silva, 2009), que também pode ser definido como movimento religioso com pretensão científica, que aventava a suposta comunicação com os mortos através de médiuns (Braude, 2008), surgiu na América ao final da década de 1840, e espalhou-se para a Europa (Braude, 2007), com grande repercussão na França (Lewgoy, 2007), perdurando por todo o século XIX, até o seu final, e alcançando a atualidade.

Os fenômenos de alegadas comunicações com os mortos despertaram interesse em todas as camadas sociais, tornando-se inclusive de interesse científico (Gauld, 1982). Pesquisadores da filosofia e da Ciência do século XIX, consagrados por suas produções intelectuais em seus campos de atuação, utilizaram os instrumentos da Ciência para investigar a possibilidade de sobrevivência da consciência à morte e a possibilidade dos chamados médiuns de supostamente entrarem em contato com os alegados mortos (Moreira-Almeida, Alexander, 2013).

1.1.1.1. O século das pesquisas psíquicas:

A segunda metade do século XIX, até meados do século XX foi período ímpar na história da Ciência, quando cientistas renomados da Europa e dos Estados Unidos interessaram-se pelas pesquisas psíquicas (Alvarado, 2002; Lachapelle, 2005).

Segundo o “*Webster's New International Dictionary of the English Language*”, as pesquisas psíquicas “lidan com a investigação do fenômeno que parece contrário às leis físicas e sugerem atividade mental fora do corpo”. De acordo com Szasz (Szasz, 1957), a definição é ambígua e sem qualquer significado científico e sugere que o melhor significado seria definir que as pesquisas psíquicas “lidam com o “oculto” que identifica o fenômeno em questão por evocar uma resposta afetiva no observador”.

As sociedades de pesquisas psíquicas visavam a aplicação de metodologia científica para testar a hipótese da sobrevivência através da comunicação com os alegados mortos, dos fenômenos de aparição, entre outros e reuniram tanto pesquisadores que aceitavam a tese da sobrevivência quanto os que negavam (Alvarado, 2003).

1.1.1.1.1. Inglaterra

A fundação da Society for Psychical Research (SPR), em 1882, na Inglaterra, permitiu a reunião de pesquisadores para a investigação de fenômenos considerados anormais, incluindo o estudo do hipnotismo, sonambulismo e histeria (Alvarado, 2002). Entre os fundadores e membros da SPR encontravam-se defensores da possibilidade de sobrevivência e aqueles que não aceitavam tal hipótese (Gauld, 2012).

Entre os objetivos da SPR listados em sua fundação estava a pesquisa imparcial dos chamados problemas psíquicos, utilizando o mesmo espírito de exatidão da ciência. Textualmente:

“to approach these various problems without the prejudice or prepossession of any kind, and in the same spirit of exact and unimpassioned inquiry which has enabled Science to solve so many problems, once not less obscure nor less hotly debated”. (Kelly e Kelly, 2007) (“para abordar esses vários problemas sem qualquer tipo de preconceito, e com o mesmo espírito de imparcialidade e exatidão que tem permitido à Ciência resolver tantos problemas, não menos obscuros e menos arduamente debatidos” – tradução livre).

Frederic Myers (1843-1901), além das atividades literárias e poéticas que o fizeram conhecido nos meios acadêmicos e literários, foi um dos fundadores da Society for Psychical Research (SPR) e seus trabalhos permitiram forte colaboração no campo científico da pesquisa da sobrevivência humana após a morte (James, 1901). Myers desenvolveu um conceito de inconsciente (Kelly e Alvarado, 2005), sendo reconhecido como um dos descobridores da mente subliminal (Ryan, 2010). Segundo Myers a

mente não se reduz ao cérebro e também é composta de uma parte que não é imediatamente acessível à consciência (Myers, 1961; Alvarado, 2002; 2013a). Pode-se comparar o conceito de “self” subliminal com o inconsciente de Freud, uma vez que Myers o descreve como “casa do tesouro”, que age de modo autônomo e criativo (Halittunen, 1988).

Ressalta-se que Myers não se deteve ao estudo das manifestações alegadamente produzidas por espíritos, mas esses estudos o levaram também ao estudo das manifestações de subpersonalidades dos médiuns e dos automatismos produzidos pela mente encarnada (Alvarado, 2010b).

Sir William Barrett (1844-1925), físico, cujos trabalhos culminaram com o desenvolvimento do ferro-silicone, usado em transformadores e que permitiu a invenção do telefone (Tymn, 2002), também membro fundador da SPR, foi pioneiro na Inglaterra no estudo das visões do leito de morte (Barret, 1926), tendo colaborado também estudos sobre manifestações mediúnicas (Barrett, 1918).

Outro membro importante da SPR inglesa foi H. Sidgwick (1838-1900), professor em Cambridge que conduziu pesquisa ampla sobre percepções anômalas entre a população (Sidgwick *et al.*, 1889; Research, 2009). O estudo consistiu de questionário elaborado pela Prof. Eleanor Sidgwick e foi aplicado por investigadores em uma população de 17000 pessoas no Reino Unido. Relatos de sonhos e outras manifestações não-alucinatórias foram excluídos e, como resultado, demonstrou-se que 9,9% da população não institucionalizada do Reino Unido relatou algum tipo de manifestação alucinatória. O *Census of Hallucination* foi estudo multicêntrico decorrente de

pesquisas realizadas na Inglaterra, França, Alemanha e Estados Unidos (Blom, 2009).

Uma detalhada análise do *Census of Hallucination* foi publicada por Parish, na forma de livro: *Hallucinations and illusions: A study of the fallacies of perception* (Parish, 1902). O autor sugere que estados anormais da consciência seriam decorrentes de atividades cerebrais semelhantes aos que ocorrem no sonho.

Sir Oliver Lodge (1851-1940), físico, cujas pesquisas colaboraram para o desenvolvimento da radiofonia e transmissão sem fio, também se interessou pelas pesquisas psíquicas desde a década de 1880 (Raia, 2007), realizou experimentos com médiuns e posicionava-se favorável à crença na sobrevivência após a morte em conferências e livros (Tymn, 2002; Lodge, 2012). Sua formação acadêmica permitiu que elaborasse especulações científicas sobre o ectoplasma (substância vaporosa que se formaria em torno de alegados médiuns em sessões chamadas de materialização de espíritos (Doyle, 2008)) e a telecinesia (ação mecânica sem atuação e sem contato sobre objetos e pessoas (Richet, 2013) relacionando os fenômenos psíquicos com os fenômenos da eletricidade (Raia, 2007).

As proposições de Lodge são lembradas como especulações de aspecto religioso e das relações entre ciência e religião (Root, 1978; Raia, 2007).

Sir William Crookes (1832-1919), químico, conduziu pesquisas científicas que colaboraram para a descoberta dos Raios X (Woodruff, 1966). Seus experimentos contribuíram para o desenvolvimento do radiômetro, com a descrição dos raios catódicos e a proposição de um quarto estado da

matéria (Crookes, 1874; 1879). O envolvimento de Crookes com o movimento espiritualista foi marcado também por críticas quanto ao método empregado nas pesquisas que conduziu nesse campo e acusações de parcialidade em suas análises de resultados (D'albe, 2013), com insinuações de um possível relacionamento com a médium Florence Cook (Brock, 2008).

1.1.1.1.2. Estados Unidos:

Na América, William James (1842-1910) ainda é lembrado por seus trabalhos em Psicologia (Simon, 1999). Foi um dos professores de Harvard mais conhecidos em todos os tempos e tido como um “herói intelectual” por conciliar a busca do conhecimento enquanto aceitava incertezas (Stone e Stone, 2000). Sua colaboração no campo das pesquisas psíquicas foi inegável e relacionada com um empirismo radical (Bricklin, 2010; Junior *et al.*, 2013; Moreira-Almeida, Alexander, 2013).

William James relacionou-se intimamente com Frederic Myers (James, 1901) e participou da SPR inglesa (Junior *et al.*, 2013), além da American Society for Psychical Research (ASPR), da qual foi um de seus fundadores (Hall *et al.*, 1885). Se alguns autores questionam se William James realmente foi espiritualista (Roback, 1942), o próprio James admite essa dúvida (James, 1911).

Muito embora a contribuição do Espiritualismo Moderno para o desenvolvimento de ideias e conceitos em Psiquiatria e Psicologia, o estudo dos alegados fenômenos mediúnicos propiciaram a formulação do conceito de subconsciência ou mente subliminal e o estudo do transe mediúnico foi relacionado com dissociação da personalidade (histeria) (Alvarado *et al.*, 2007). A Psicologia americana e a europeia do início do século XX

combateram fortemente os espiritualistas, incluindo James, por tentar estabelecer-se como disciplina experimental e científica que tinha nas manifestações neurológicas o seu substrato (Coon, 1992).

J.H. Hyslop (1854-1920), filósofo, professor de Ética da Columbia University, foi um dos fundadores da ASPR. Hyslop descreve que, “*ante os fatos espirituais, existem dois modos de estudar tais fenômenos, o materialista, que nega a priori, e o que assume que existe um significado nas manifestações espirituais*” (Hyslop, 1906).

Hyslop, como pesquisador psíquico, publicou estudo sobre visões no leito de morte (Alvarado, 2014b), por considerá-las fortes evidências da possível autonomia da consciência em relação ao cérebro e de sua possível sobrevivência após a morte. A tese de Hyslop foi combatida por Clarke, que apresentou argumentos fisiopatológicos sobre a morte cerebral como causa de alucinações no final da vida (Clarke, 1885).

Entre os que não consideravam os estudos dos chamados fenômenos espirituais, produzidos pelos médiuns, como importante para a Psicologia, está Hugo Münsterberg, psicólogo da Harvard University, que afirmou que “a psicologia científica não deve se ocupar de fenômenos místicos” (Coon, 1992; Sommer, 2012).

1.1.1.1.3. França:

Se o moderno espiritualismo tem suas origens fenomênicas nos Estados Unidos (Braude, 2001), na França as manifestações mediúnicas encontraram em Hypolite Léon Denizard Rivail, ou Allan Kardec, um estudioso sistemático, que propôs fazer uso de uma metodologia de estudo criteriosa e com pretensão científica (Moreira-Almeida, 2008).

O pesquisador das Ciências Psíquicas mais laureado pela Ciência Médica foi Charles Richet (1850-1935), agraciado com o Prêmio Nobel de Medicina e Fisiologia em 1913 por seus estudos em anafilaxia (Mazana e Ariño, 1991).

Richet foi um cientista criativo por não se deter em apenas uma área de estudo. Seu interesse ativo sobre o sonambulismo persistiu em paralelo com os estudos sobre anafilaxia e sobre vários outros temas. Foi autor de 700 publicações científicas, além de estudos literários e poéticos (Wolf, 1993; Haas, 2001).

O interesse de Richet pelos estados diferenciados da consciência, ou do subconsciente da época, data do início de sua vida profissional. Em 1880 publicou estudo sobre o sonambulismo provocado, onde postula a hipótese de provocar-se estado de transe sonambúlico através da indução mental e discorre sobre a base fisiológica do sonambulismo (Richet, 1880).

Richet fez a proposição de uma nova área da ciência, que chamou Metapsíquica, que teria por objetivo o estudo da Criptoestesia (termo amplo utilizado para designar experiências de clarividência, premonições, psicometria e telepatia), da Telecinesia e da Ectoplasmia (Richet, 1923). O Instituto Metapsíquico Internacional foi fundado em Paris, em 1919, em moldes semelhantes aos da SPR, com objetivo de trazer um modelo de pesquisas psíquicas. Entretanto, teve curta duração, após frustradas tentativas de apresentar para o cenário científico mundial pesquisas sobre imortalidade (Lachapelle, 2005). Apesar de sua dedicação às pesquisas psíquicas, Charles Richet negava a possibilidade de sobrevivência após a morte (Richet, 2013).

Paul Gibier (1851-1900) foi diretor do *Pasteur Institute* em Nova York (EUA) e tornou-se adepto das ideias espiritualistas. Em defesa de suas ideias, escreveu um artigo de divulgação publicado na *The North American Review Magazine* onde propõe a ação social do médico como agente de uma transformação social pela erradicação de males causados pelo materialismo e cita a crença espiritualista como propositora de uma ordem social mais ajustada à saúde do homem e das nações (Gibier, 1895). O artigo citado não tem conotação científica e expressa as ideias pessoais de Gibier.

Gustave Geley (1868-1924) teve papel secundário entre os pesquisadores das ciências psíquicas na França. Em 1905, propôs que se reformulasse a metodologia de pesquisas até então utilizadas, visando maior proteção contra fraudes como forma de garantir credibilidade (Lachapelle, 2005), todavia as modificações por ele propostas não rompiam com o modelo até então adotado, onde a descrição dos fatos observados por pessoas consideradas idôneas era ponto primordial de fidedignidade dos resultados.

1.1.1.1.4. Itália:

Cesare Lombroso (1835-1909), psiquiatra, antropólogo e higienista vienense, interessou-se pelas pesquisas psíquicas e analisou pessoalmente vários médiuns, incluindo Eusápio Palladino, tendo utilizado critérios médicos de análise como dinamômetros, cardiógrafos, eletroscópios e balanças (Harris e Alvarado, 2014). Lombroso acreditava na veracidade do fenômeno analisado e também, em suas descrições detalhadas de médico e pesquisador, relatou dados sobre a saúde mental de Paladino, sugerindo que a médium apresentava sinais de histeria (Lombroso e Kennedy, 1909; Alvarado, 2009a; 2011; Harris e Alvarado, 2014).

Outro psiquiatra italiano a interessar-se pelas pesquisas psíquicas foi Enrico Morselli (1852-1929), que corroborou teoria que permitiu a Crawford associar ao ectoplasma analogia com mecanismo que funcionaria como uma espécie de alavanca psíquica, justificando supostos fenômenos de levitação (Crawford, 1998; Alvarado, 2014a). Enrico Morselli, como Richet, defendia uma teoria psicodinâmica para justificar os fenômenos de efeito físico por ele estudados, sem aceitar a tese de manifestação de supostos espíritos desencarnados (Alvarado, 2011).

Ernesto Bozzano (1862-1943), professor de Filosofia da Ciência da Universidade de Turim, foi correspondente de vários jornais espiritualistas e publicou considerável volume de livros, onde descreve experiências por ele testemunhadas, conduzidas e estudadas. Seu interesse e rigor de exame científicos o fez ser muito versátil nesse campo ao estudar em profundidade fenômenos de bilocação, experiências fora do corpo (*EFC*), experiências no leito de morte, mediunidade, fenômenos de materialização de espíritos, fotografia de espíritos. Bozzano foi tardeamente reconhecido pelos pesquisadores da imortalidade (Siegel e Hirschman, 1983; Alvarado, 1987; 2005; 2007; Leão e Lotufo Neto, 2007; Alvarado, 2013c) mas se destacou pelas extensas revisões realizadas e livros escritos sobre o tema e não propriamente por ser um pesquisador experimental (Alvarado, 2013c).

1.2. Telepatia e Percepção Extra-Sensorial:

William McDougall (1871-1938), segundo Egil Asprem (Asprem, 2010), teve papel destacado no desenvolvimento da parapsicologia por sustentar e defender a necessidade de aplicação de métodos da moderna psicologia para as pesquisas psíquicas. McDougall colaborou para o direcionamento

editorial do *Journal of Parapsychology*, que tinha a pretensão de se alinhar com as publicações acadêmicas aceitas como científicas (Broughton, 1987).

Em 1934, J. B. Rhine publicou a monografia *Extra-Sensorial Perception* (Rhine, 1973; Gordon, 1982), cuja proposta foi a apresentação de metodologia para as pesquisas sobre Percepção Extra-Sensorial (PES), com utilização de critérios de validação científica em que se destacava a utilização de análise estatística para avaliação probabilística, utilização de procedimentos padrão para as pesquisas (como a utilização de cartões em pesquisas de telepatia e clarividência), e consequente modificação do método utilizado pelos pesquisadores de fenômenos psíquicos até então (Allison, 1979). Os trabalhos de Rhine tiveram suporte de McDougall (Gordon, 1982), responsável pela cadeira de Psicologia da Universidade de Duke nos Estados Unidos.

Segundo Alvarado (Alvarado, 2003), Rhine foi, inicialmente, influenciado pela tese da sobrevivência após a morte, todavia, sua ênfase nas pesquisas sobre telepatia criou uma mudança nas conclusões dos experimentos e análise de relatos de casos, substituindo a ação dos “mortos” pela atuação de telepatia e percepção super-extrassensorial (Stevenson, 1977b).

1.3. Panorama Atual das Publicações sobre Autonomia da Consciência em Relação ao Cérebro:

Richard Lewontin (Lewontin, 1997), professor emérito de Harvard, em artigo escrito em revista popular de grande alcance nos Estados Unidos, ao analisar o livro de Carl Sagan “O Mundo Assombrado por Demônios”, reforça a sua convicção materialística como única forma de conhecimento científico;

os demônios listados por Sagan em seu livro (as crenças em visitas de extraterrestres, fenômenos telepáticos e percepção extra-sensorial, espiritualismo, entre outros) devem ser combatidos e estatui que os materialistas devem rejeitar aprioristicamente toda e qualquer evidência do sobrenatural, ou seja, os demônios acima listados, pois não podem permitir um “pé divino” na porta. Newberg relata que as chamadas experiências espirituais sofrem críticas metodológicas apriorísticas (Newberg e Lee, 2005), confirmando que as restrições de Lewontin contra as pesquisas que tentam abordar temas considerados como metafísicos são relevantes mas não necessariamente científicas.

Apesar da forte oposição dos meios acadêmicos e da grande dificuldade em publicação de resultados, as pesquisas sobre imortalidade não tiveram solução de continuidade, muito embora tenha ocorrido marcante declínio ao longo do século XX (Cardeña, 2014).

Ian Stevenson (1918-2007) foi um dos pesquisadores em imortalidade mais influentes da atualidade. Suas pesquisas abrangeram vários tópicos. Apesar da notoriedade em pesquisas sobre reencarnação, foi um dos pioneiros em Experiências de Quase-Morte, além de ter pesquisado Telepatia, Mediunidade e Experiências Anômalas. Em um de seus últimos artigos, Stevenson relata seus 50 anos de atividade como pesquisador de fenômenos paranormais (Stevenson, 2007). Stevenson mereceu homenagem póstuma do Journal of Scientific Explorations, que lhe dedicou toda uma edição (Journal of Scientific Exploration, Vol. 22, No. 1, 2008), composta de 26 artigos e um editorial.

Stevenson atuou em praticamente todas as áreas de investigação da imortalidade, quais sejam, mediunidade (Stevenson, 1973; Haraldsson e Stevenson, 1974; Stevenson, 1990b), experiências de quase-morte (Stevenson e Greyson, 1979; Greyson e Stevenson, 1980; Pasricha e Stevenson, 1986; Stevenson, Cook, et al., 1989; Owens et al., 1990; Kellehear et al., 1994; Cook et al., 1998; Kelly et al., 2000; Athappilly et al., 2006; Fleck et al., 2008), experiências no leito de morte(Stevenson, 1983b), experiências fora do corpo(Stevenson e Cook, 1995), fenômenos de transe e possessão(Stevenson, 1976; Azuma e Stevenson, 1988; Stevenson, Pasricha, et al., 1989) e, principalmente, reencarnação – memórias sugestivas de vidas passadas (Stevenson, 1966; 1970; Stevenson e Story, 1970; Pasricha e Stevenson, 1977; Stevenson, 1977a; 1983a; 1985; 1986; Chadha e Stevenson, 1988; Lan Stevenson e Samaratni21, 1988; Stevenson e Samaratne, 1988; Stevenson, 1990a; Stevenson e Chadha, 1990; Stevenson, 1993; 1994; Stevenson e Cook, 1995; Keil e Stevenson, 1999; Stevenson, 1999; Stevenson e Keil, 2000).

1.4. Imortalidade na literatura biomédica:

No contexto atual, a literatura biomédica regista artigos sobre supostas evidências da imortalidade do ser humano após a morte, notadamente publicados em revistas indexadas em importantes bancos de artigos biomédicos. As principais linhas de pesquisas acerca desse assunto serão reportadas abaixo:

1.4.1. Mediunidade:

A mediunidade, ou alegada capacidade de comunicar-se com os mortos, é melhor definida como “um conjunto de experiências nas quais um

indivíduo (o médium) alega entrar em contato com, ou estar sob, o controle da personalidade de uma pessoa já falecida" (Moreira-Almeida, 2012).

Ainda que mantenha ligações estreitas com os domínios das ciências sociais e da religião, a mediunidade mereceu atenção científica e tem influenciado a psiquiatria a partir da segunda metade do século XIX e no início do século XX (De Almeida e Neto, 2004; Alvarado *et al.*, 2007).

Allan Kardec, pseudônimo do professor francês Hypolite Léon Denizard Rivail, interessou-se pelo estudo das alegadas manifestações das personalidades tidas como mortas e criou metodologia sistemática para pesquisa da mediunidade, e é considerado como um dos pioneiros na proposta de investigação científica da mediunidade (Moreira-Almeida, 2008).

Porém, para grande parte dos autores, o estudo científico da mediunidade teve início com os trabalhos da SPR, em 1882 (Stevenson, 1977b; Alvarado, 2002; 2003; Kelly e Alvarado, 2005; Alvarado *et al.*, 2007; Alvarado, 2009b; Research, 2009; Alvarado, 2013a).

A relação entre mediunidade e as manifestações neurológicas que se expressam de variadas maneiras, conhecidas à época como histeria e automatismos fisiológicos foi alvo contínuo de investigação da SPR e, segundo Alvarado, teve importante papel na história da Psiquiatria (Alvarado, 2002). Acrescenta-se também a potencial influência da mediunidade no desenvolvimento das neurociências, pela colaboração na compreensão das relações mente-cérebro (Moreira-Almeida, 2012; Moreira-Almeida, Alexander, 2013), no desenvolvimento de idéias e nosologias psiquiátricas (Alvarado *et al.*, 2007; Le Maléfan *et al.*, 2013).

A mediunidade foi o alvo das investigações da SPR (Oppenheim, 1988) e o já referido “Censo das Alucinações” pode ser descrito como o primeiro estudo transversal sobre mediunidade (Blom, 2009).

A associação entre mediunidade e doenças mentais foi postulada pela literatura médica e por profissionais de saúde (Alvarado, 1982a; Moreira-Almeida *et al.*, 2005; De Almeida, 2007; Alvarado, 2010a; b; Alvarado e Zingrone, 2012). O estudo das manifestações não-usuais da consciência, conduzido entre 1889 e 1892 pela SPR com o título “Census of Wake hallucinations” não descartava a possibilidade da associação entre o que pode ser chamado fenômeno mediúnico de alucinação patológica (Blom, 2009). A excitação cerebral poderia ser a causa dos supostos fenômenos mediúnicos (Oppenheim, 1988; Wolf, 1993; Alvarado, 2011; Morselli, 2011).

As pesquisas de médiuns e manifestações alegadas como fenômenos de supostas manifestações de espíritos sempre estiveram sujeitas a fraudes. As metodologias aplicadas desde o século XIX tinham por objetivo verificar se tais manifestações, chamadas mediúnicas, eram ou não fraudulentas.

Fraude sempre esteve presente como argumento contrário aos vários estudos descritivos de casos de mediunidade surgidos na literatura científica do final do século XIX e primeira metade do século XX. Casos como o da médium Margery, acusada de fraude pelo casal Rhine, é apenas um entre vários casos publicados na literatura científica (Rhine e Rhine, 1927). Outro caso que chamou a atenção de pesquisadores de sua época foi o de fraude que envolveu o filósofo e pesquisador H. H. Price e o médium Rudi Schneider (Gregory, 1977).

Eusapia Palladino (1854-1918), médium italiana capaz de produzir grande variedade de manifestações, participou de dezenas de estudos e os resultados sugestivos de manifestações de supostos “espíritos” foram maculados também pela ocorrência de manifestações fraudulentas (Alvarado, 1993; 2011). Alvarado cita a análise médica de Eusapia Palladino, conduzida por Morselli, que relatou diagnóstico de diabetes e sinais de histeria (Alvarado, 2011)

As metodologias aplicadas para análise de médiuns geraram controvérsias importantes nos resultados das pesquisas sobre mediunidade. Se as denúncias de fraude tornaram-se frequentes (Lamont e Lamont, 2004), fenômenos onde a fraude não pode ser detectada fizeram que a possibilidade de realidade permanecesse e dirigesse o foco para pesquisas envolvendo telepatia (Mulacz, 2005) e recepção de informações anômalas, um termo que compreende a mediunidade sem descartar telepatia (Milton e Wiseman, 1999).

O conceito de mediunidade descrito por Moreira-Almeida (Moreira-Almeida, 2012) é neutro sobre a causa última da experiência. Entre as causas de tal experiências pode-se relacionar: manifestações telepáticas, manifestações do inconsciente, alucinações, fraude e também a de manifestação de pessoas alegadamente desencarnadas.

Os estudos científicos sobre mediunidade tem resultados controversos, com questionamentos metodológicos e de resultados (O'keeffe e Wiseman, 2005; Beischel e Schwartz, 2007; Kelly e Arcangel, 2011).

Uma forma de controle aplicado em pesquisas são metodologias de estudos cegos. Um estudo pode ser cego para os participantes, para os

pesquisadores, para os analistas de resultados, ou para todos esses integrantes. Estudos cegos aumentam o nível de evidência das pesquisas (Schulz e Grimes, 2002).

Estudos duplo ou triplo-cegos em mediunidade (Beischel e Schwartz, 2007), prece (Collipp, 1969; Dusek *et al.*, 2002) e cura à distância (Astin *et al.*, 2000) geraram perspectivas promissoras pela metodologia aplicada, mas ainda conflitantes.

Recentemente a mediunidade foi analisada como manifestação natural e distinta de transtorno dissociativo e psiquiátrico (Moreira-Almeida *et al.*, 2007; Hageman *et al.*, 2010), e há evidência sugestivas que os médiuns tem melhores indicadores de saúde mental em relação à população em geral (Moreira-Almeida, A. *et al.*, 2008), todavia o estudo focou médiuns e não o produto da alegada mediunidade.

Estudo de neuroimagem avaliou tipo específico de manifestação mediúnica, psicografia ou escrita automática, e sugeriu que a escrita durante transe mediúnico provoca alterações em áreas cerebrais distintas das ativadas durante a escrita consciente (Peres *et al.*, 2012).

A alegada capacidade de receber informações de espíritos desencarnados através da psicografia do médium brasileiro conhecido como Chico Xavier, foi analisada utilizando-se instrumentos para avaliação da acurácia de cartas supostamente psicografadas pelo médium que teriam sido escritas por um alegado espírito; os resultados foram publicados na literatura médica (Rocha *et al.*, 2014). Outro estudo analisou informações sobre a glândula pineal e publicada em livros da década de 1940, alegadamente

recebidas através da psicografia do mesmo médium brasileiro (Lucchetti, Giancarlo et al., 2013).

1.4.2. Experiências de Quase-Morte (EQM):

As características das experiências vividas por pessoas que sobreviveram após a morte clínica foram nomeadas de Experiência de Quase-Morte (EQM) por Moody Jr (Greyson, 2007). Moody descreveu 15 características comuns aos americanos que relataram ter tido EQM (Athappilly et al., 2006; Lommel, 2010), sendo elas:

(1) Inefabilidade, dificuldade em descrever a experiência linguisticamente; (2) escutar os relatos da própria morte pronunciada pela equipe médica, familiares ou outros; (3) sensação de paz contagiente; (4) barulhos, algumas vezes descritos como música bela ou sirenes e campainhas desagradáveis; (5) sensação de túnel ou lugar escuro e fechado; (6) sensação de estar fora do corpo, algumas vezes acompanhada da visão do próprio corpo em outro local, algumas vezes acompanhadas de sensações e emoções não pertencentes ao corpo físico; (7) encontro com seres espirituais, algumas vezes não identificados mas outras vezes identificados como seres desencarnados ou figuras religiosas; (8) um “Ser de Luz”, com frequência descrito como entidade amorosa que manifesta luz sobrenatural e brilhante; (9) revisão da própria vida, algumas vezes sob a tutela do “Ser de Luz” e algumas vezes acompanhada de sensação de julgamento; (10) uma fronteira que demarca os limites entre a vida terrestre e a vida após a morte; (11) retorno à vida, algumas vezes descrito como tomada de decisão de voltar ao corpo ou

ter sido enviado de volta involuntariamente; (12) dizer aos outros sobre a experiência e frequentemente receber reprovação pelos relatos; (13) efeitos sobre a própria vida, com frequência descrito como interesse em assuntos de espiritualidade, aumento da valorização da vida, amor aos outros; (14) diminuição do medo da morte e convicção na sobrevivência após a morte; (15) confirmação por parte da equipe médica e dos familiares que os conhecimentos adquiridos pelo experimentador durante o evento descrito não pôde ser obtido por vias normais de percepção (Moody, 1979).

Os relatos de experiências no limiar da morte antecedem a denominação de Moody. Relatos de experiências do tipo das descritas como EQM datam de 1858, pelo Almirante Francis Beaufort que sobreviveu a um afogamento (Stevenson e Cook, 1995). Relatos anedóticos sobre EQM dão conta da ocorrência desse tipo de fenômeno desde a Idade Média (Zaleski, 1988) e o mito de Er, descrito por Platão em “A República” pode ser considerado um relato de EQM (Van Der Sluijs, 2009).

Alvarado (Alvarado, 2005; 2006) chama a atenção para os relatos de Bozzano e Barret sobre experiências chamadas de crise da morte e que apresentam correspondência com as EQM pelos relatos de experiências fora do corpo, mas foram pouco valorizadas pelos pesquisadores atuais e Gasperini (Gasperini, 2011) também ressalta o trabalho pioneiro de Bozzano ao descrever fenômenos no leito de morte que se assemelham às EQM.

Desde a descrição de Moody, a literatura médica produziu centenas de artigos sobre EQM, a maioria deles, estudos descritivos de relatos/séries de casos e transversais. Em um estudo recente, Sleutjes et al. (2014) identificou

266 artigos sobre EQM no banco Web of Knowledge, com predomínio de artigos de opinião (resenhas de livros, comentários e editoriais), artigos de revisão e de descrição fenomenológica. Entretanto, esses autores observaram um aumento do número de estudos transversais e longitudinais desde o ano 2000.

A venda do livro de Moody superou 10 milhões de cópias nos Estados Unidos e cerca de 8 milhões de americanos relataram ter tido EQM (Athappilly *et al.*, 2006). Para avaliar os relatos de EQM e avaliar as supostas experiências em seus vários aspectos, Ring propôs uma escala que denominou *Weight Core Experience Index* (WCEI) (Ring, 1982), baseado nas quinze características descritas por Moody Jr., Essa escala incluía como experiências reais aquelas que atingiam escores iguais ou superiores a 7 (Lommel, 2010).

Greyson modificou a escala WCEI visando eliminar possibilidade de relatos falso-positivos (Greyson, 1983). A escala de Greyson permite avaliar população para ocorrência de EQM (Lommel, 2010).

Estima-se que a EQM ocorre entre 10 a 18% de todos os casos de ressuscitação exitosa de PCR (Van Lommel *et al.*, 2001; Greyson, 2003; 2007; Lommel, 2010).

Estudo prospectivo publicado por Van Lommel e colaboradores em 2001 (Van Lommel *et al.*, 2001), acompanhou durante até 8 anos 344 sobreviventes de parada cardio-respiratória e destes, 62 (ou 18%) relataram EQM, definida como “*relato de memória de todas as impressões durante estado especial de consciência*”. Dos pacientes acompanhados por Van Lommel, 56% relataram emoções positivas com a EQM, 50% tiveram

sensação de estarem mortos e 32% relataram ter encontrado pessoas já falecidas durante a experiência (Van Lommel *et al.*, 2001; Lommel, 2010).

Os relatos da população infantil que tratam da ocorrência de EQM sugerem que as crianças que sofreram EQM descrevem as mesmas características apontadas pelos adultos, como a passagem por um túnel de luz e o encontro com um ser de luz (Morse, 1983; Morse *et al.*, 1985; Morse *et al.*, 1986; Serdahely, 1990).

Fatores culturais parecem não influenciar nas descrições dos pacientes que sofreram EQM (Blackmore, 1993) (Kellehear *et al.*, 1994). Pasricha e Stevenson identificaram diferenças culturais entre os relatos dos indianos que sofreram EQM em relação aos americanos, mas alertaram sobre as experiências apresentarem natureza semelhante entre culturas, diferindo apenas em detalhes (Pasricha e Stevenson, 1986).

O termo EQM foi considerado como insuficiente para descrever os fenômenos que podem ocorrer durante a parada cardio-respiratória (PCR), pois na PCR *per si* podem ocorrer percepções visuais ou auditivas sem que ocorram os fenômenos normalmente relacionados com a EQM (Parnia e Parnia, 2007).

Publicação recente teve como objetivo avaliar a incidência de percepções conscientes durante PCR e a ressuscitação, porém, apesar do design apropriado, os resultados não permitiram análises detalhadas dos relatos de EQM, todavia permitiram avaliar fenômenos de consciência desperta durante a PCR, como experiências auditivas, por exemplo (Parnia *et al.*, 2014).

Não existe ainda o conhecimento dos mecanismos que levam aos processos cognitivos das EQM e entre as postulações encontram-se alterações eletrofisiológicas do Lobo Temporal (Persinger, 1983; Britton e Bootzin, 2004), hipóxia decorrente da PCR (Martens, 1994), ativação de múltiplos receptores, como o Receptor-NDMA, receptor serotoninérgico, dentre outros (Parnia *et al.*, 2007).

As principais críticas à hipótese da consciência como função independente do funcionamento cerebral em estudos sobre EQM são relacionadas a alterações cerebrais durante a parada cardíodo-respiratória.

A hipótese de hipóxia durante a parada cardíaca como causa dos relatos de EQM devido ao efeito tóxico da hipercarbia e hipoxemia provocarem alucinações, foi citado por Martens como argumento contrário à hipótese de fenômeno de consciência durante a PCR, como função independente do cérebro (Martens, 1994) e autores como Rodin descrevem os relatos como corolários de uma psicose tóxica(Rodin, 1980).

Efeitos produzidos pela ketamina, agente anestésico utilizado durante PCR, através de atuação em áreas cerebrais, como hipocampo, podem provocar experiências semelhantes às relatadas pelos pacientes que alegaram ter apresentado EQM (Jansen, 1997).

O que se deve ressaltar é que os modelos neurobiológicos apresentados, ainda que ofereçam hipótese que as alterações sugestivas de persistência de fenômenos da consciência durante a parada cardio-respiratória sejam fenômenos cerebrais, não conseguem descartar que tais evidências de atividades cognitivas possam ocorrer de modo independente do cérebro (Saavedra-Aguilar e Gómez-Jeria, 1989).

Os estudos sobre EQM podem ser considerados como instrumentos para analisar a hipótese da autonomia da consciência em relação ao cérebro, como a ampliação da consciência em período crítico do organismo, descrição de experiência fora do corpo e percepção de fatos que ocorrem próximo ou remotamente ao corpo e descrição de conhecimento de eventos não acessíveis pelos sentidos usuais da pessoa (Kelly *et al.*, 2000). O estudo das publicações originais na literatura científica sobre EQM é importante para avaliar hipótese que possa sugerir evidências científicas sobre a sobrevivência.

1.4.3. Experiências no final da vida (EFV), visões no leito de morte, lucidez terminal:

Entre os estudiosos das experiências no leito de morte, destaca-se os trabalhos pioneiros de Barret, na Inglaterra (Barrett, 1918; Barret, 1926); Ernesto Bozzano, na Itália (Bozzano, 1982; Siegel e Hirschman, 1983; Alvarado, 2007) e Hyslop, nos Estados Unidos (Hyslop, 1906; Alvarado, 2014b).

Osis (Osis, 1961), entre 1959 e 1960 obteve informações de 640 médicos e enfermeiras sobre visões no leito de morte de pacientes terminais e replicou o mesmo trabalho em 1977, abrangendo pacientes de duas culturas distintas, Estados Unidos e Índia, e os resultados foram coincidentes, demonstrando que as supostas visões no leito de morte eram predominantemente de figuras humanas (Osis e Haraldsson, 1977).

As visões de leito de morte são tratadas por alguns como efeito de alucinações que confortam (Houran e Lange, 1997), afirmação contestada por outros, uma vez que existem evidências que algumas visões no leito de

morte podem corresponder a evento real confirmado e que ocorre à distância, não sendo fruto de alucinação (Mazzarino-Willett, 2010; Fenwick e Brayne, 2011).

As EFV consistem de fenômenos mais amplos que as visões no leito de morte e incluem a habilidade de transitar a outra realidade, aparições do moribundo a pessoas amadas coincidentes com o momento da morte, coincidências outras que ocorrem na hora relatada da morte (Fenwick *et al.*, 2010).

As aparições que os pacientes relatam nos momentos finais e próximos à morte, trazem conforto por significarem uma despedida (Fenwick e Brayne, 2011). As comunicações no leito de morte podem gerar conforto ao morrer (Lawrence e Repede, 2013).

Uma das características das chamadas experiências do leito de morte é o emergir de um estado mental normal ou ampliado, em pacientes até então inconscientes ou com alterações mentais impeditivas de lucidez, imediatamente antes da morte e que se caracteriza por uma suposta elevação espiritual e ampliação do humor, sendo esse estado chamado lucidez terminal (Nahm, 2009). Os casos de LT reacendem o questionamento da primazia do cérebro sobre a consciência e destacam a capacidade de a consciência não se deter aos impedimentos cerebrais em situações extremas, sugerindo autonomia da consciência sobre o seu órgão de expressão.

Como as experiências no leito de morte são geralmente relatadas por cuidadores, Fenwick e Brayne criaram um manual para cuidadores (Brayne e Fenwick, 2008).

As EFV são campo de pesquisa para o estudo da possível autonomia da consciência em relação ao cérebro. A metodologia aplicada à maioria desses estudos é baseada em relatos de cuidadores e de pacientes em estado terminal. A descrição de visões no leito de morte, por pacientes terminais são descritas como comparáveis a uma alucinação (Osis e Haraldsson, 1977), porém diferem do estado patológico por serem associadas com atitudes como paz interior e aceitação da morte (Brayne *et al.*, 2008). A atitude intempestiva de sedação ou uso de antipsicóticos prescritos pela equipe médica a pacientes no momento da morte por diagnosticarem possível sofrimento, podem comprometer a apreciação do fenômeno em mais larga escala.

Avaliação da literatura permite selecionar estudos prospectivos de EFV que parecem contribuir de forma significativa ao propósito desta revisão sistemática.

1.4.4. Experiências fora do corpo (EFC):

A experiência fora do corpo, definida como “episódio breve no qual o *self* é percebido fora do corpo” (De Ridder *et al.*, 2007), pode ocorrer de forma autônoma e espontânea (Smith e Irwin, 1981; Blackmore, S. J., 1986), ou induzida por substâncias diversas, como ketamina (Wilkins *et al.*, 2011). As EFC são um dos componentes das EQM (Lommel, 2010) e podem ocorrer em casos de doenças como enxaqueca (Irwin, 1983), epilepsia (Heydrich *et al.*, 2011), síncope cardiológica (Brandt *et al.*, 2009) ou como manifestação paranormal, sem associação com doenças (Alvarado, 1982b). O termo autoscopia, também utilizado pelos pesquisadores na área, refere-se à

impressão de ver o corpo de uma perspectiva visual e espacial distante e elevada e pode ser considerada equivalente às EFC (De Ridder *et al.*, 2007).

Relatos de EFC e fenômenos de autoscopia ocorrem em casos de transtornos mentais e neurológicos (Blanke e Mohr, 2005), todavia existem evidências que esses fenômenos podem ocorrer em transtornos psiquiátricos e serem caracterizados como manifestação não patológica e não relacionada à doença (Blackmore, S., 1986).

Pessoas normais que relataram ao menos uma experiência de EFC, quando comparado com voluntários que não relataram tal experiência, apresentaram escores mais elevados em uma escala de esquizotipia (McCreery e Claridge, 2002). Outros autores sugerem que a esquizotipia, como mediadora entre experiências paranormais e sensação de bem estar emocional, relaciona-se com experiências agradáveis classificadas nessas condições como esquizotipia positiva, distinta da esquizotipia negativa, em que há desorganização cognitiva e é associada a possível transtorno mental (Schofield e Claridge, 2007).

Os resultados gerados ao se utilizar “autoscopia” como termo de pesquisa na literatura científica, são relacionados, com mais frequência, a transtornos psiquiátricos e neurológicos. Grotstein (Grotstein, 1983), em revisão de literatura e análise de oito casos, concluiu que a autoscopia é mais frequente do que geralmente se percebe e pode ocorrer em estados *borderline* e em desordens do Sistema Nervoso Central. Maillard concluiu que a autoscopia apresenta um componente ictal e relacionou com convulsões do lobo parietal (Maillard *et al.*, 2004). Todavia, Ring propôs o

termo (autoscopia) para definir possíveis EFC que ocorrem durante as EQM (Ring, 1982).

A escassez de estudos controlados sobre EFC dificulta esse campo de experiências psíquicas como fonte de literatura científica sobre evidências de sobrevivência após a morte. Os estudos sobre EFC com pessoas normais geralmente são estudos transversais e não controlados, onde os sujeitos pesquisados geralmente respondem a questionários sobre as possíveis experiências (Twemlow *et al.*, 1982).

1.4.5. Memórias de Vidas Passadas (MVP ou Reencarnação):

A ideia da reencarnação pode ser apresentada como “hipótese explanadora de vários aspectos da personalidade humana, não esclarecidos de modo satisfatório pelas teorias em voga” (Stevenson, 1977a).

Os estudos que sugerem reencarnação inicialmente se concentraram em relatos de casos de memória espontânea sugestiva de lembranças de vidas passadas (Stevenson, 2006).

As pesquisas de Stevenson no campo de memórias sugestivas de vidas passadas teve metodologia de investigação minuciosa do relato de crianças de várias partes do mundo que evocaram memórias que poderiam corresponder a outra personalidade que teria vivido anteriormente e que possivelmente animava o corpo da criança sob análise (Stevenson, 2000).

Todavia, a publicação de grande número de trabalhos sobre investigações da hipótese reencarnação sugerem que tal tópico pode ser um tema de investigação científica e não apenas componente de um sistema de crenças religiosas (Mills *et al.*, 1994).

O tipo de morte da suposta personalidade anterior, evocada por memórias sugestivas de vidas passadas, relatadas por crianças, tendem a ser do tipo violenta, como assassinatos e acidentes (Chadha e Stevenson, 1988).

A ocorrência de marcas de nascença, geralmente nevos pigmentados e moluscos, podem correlacionar-se com descrição de achados em autópsia da alegada personalidade anterior, correlacionando-se com o tipo de morte violenta e ocorrem em até 35% das crianças que lembram de supostas vidas passadas (Stevenson, 1993).

As lembranças sugestivas de vidas passadas, evocadas por métodos de regressão de memória, são controversos e questionáveis (Stevenson, 1994). Excepcionalmente se relacionam com inexplicadas e raras alterações orgânicas (anatômicas e funcionais) (Lucchetti, Giancarlo *et al.*, 2013).

A criação de memórias falsas, principalmente induzidas por psicoterapia e hipnose, é estudado na literatura médica (Spanos *et al.*, 1999) e no caso de lembrança de vidas passadas, a possibilidade de memórias falsas é sempre aventada (Meyersburg *et al.*, 2009), principalmente em lembranças de adultos e em hipnose.

Fato marcante quando se analisa lembranças espontâneas em crianças são os indícios que as supostas memórias de vidas passadas apresentadas durante a infância permanecem na fase adulta (Haraldsson e Abu-Izzedin, 2012).

1.4.6. Fenômeno de Transe e Possessão Espiritual (TPE):

Possessão espiritual refere-se, de modo geral, à pressão exercida sobre o ser humano por forças externas, ou entidades mais poderosas que

ela própria (Boddy, 1994). A Classificação Internacional das Doenças (CID-10) define o transtorno de Transe e Possessão como:

“Desordens nas quais existe uma perda temporária tanto do senso da identidade pessoal e total consciência do que ocorre ao redor; em alguns casos, o indivíduo age como se tomado por outra personalidade, espírito, divindade ou “força”. A atenção e a consciência podem estar limitadas ou concentradas sobre um ou dois aspectos do ambiente e existe com frequencia uma repetição limitada de movimentos, posturas e verbalizações. Somente os transtornos de transe que são involuntários ou indesejados e que infringem em atividades ordinárias ocorrendo em ambientes (ou como sendo uma extensão de) religiosos ou outras situações culturalmente aceitas, devem ser incluídas sob esse termo.” (World Health Organization, 1992).

Ocupa papel importante no estudo comparado das religiões, na fenomenologia religiosa, na sociologia das religiões, na antropologia e na psicologia (Lewis, 1966). É prevalente em certas culturas ancestrais e modernas, orientais e africanas (Lewis, 1966; Betty, 2005) mas também apresenta interesse médico por suas repercussões orgânicas e psíquicas (Freed e Freed, 1964; Kenny, 1981; Castillo, 1994).

Estados alterados de consciência, que sugerem possessão espiritual, como os da mediunidade, podem ser utilizados em setting terapêutico (Simões, 2002), mas há carência de estudos científicos prospectivos, amplos, sobre o tema.

Em uma parcela da população, notadamente em alguns grupos culturais, estados dissociativos facilmente confundidos com transtornos psicóticos, ocorrem em pessoas que não são portadoras de doenças

psiquiátricas e diferenciar experiências espirituais de transtornos psiquiátricos é um desafio à Psiquiatria (Moreira-Almeida e Cardeña, 2011).

Como indício de autonomia da consciência em relação ao cérebro, o tema apresenta algumas referências que necessitam de validação em outras culturas, mas sugerem características que devem ser ressaltadas.

Moreira-Almeida e colaboradores (Moreira-Almeida *et al.*, 2007) examinaram médiuns brasileiros, que apesar de apresentarem pontuações altas pelo SRQ (que sugeriria doença mental), obtiveram melhores índices de qualidade de vida, e de ajustamento socio-cultural, tornando pouco provável o diagnóstico de doença mental pelos critérios atualmente disponíveis, em população específica. O mesmo achado foi encontrado pelo autor quando comparou médiuns brasileiros com americanos portadores de Transtornos Dissociativos (Moreira-Almeida, A. *et al.*, 2008). Em revisão de literatura, o mesmo autor sugere novas direções metodológicas para diferenciar experiências espirituais de transtornos dissociativos (Menezes Júnior e Moreira-Almeida, 2009).

O tópico de estudo oferece algumas evidências que podem indicar autonomia da consciência em relação ao cérebro.

1.4.7. Relação Mente-Cérebro (RMC), Transcomunicação (TC), Detecção de Espíritos (DE):

A suposta comunicação direta com seres espirituais, através de instrumentos, transcomunicação instrumental, fez que alguns autores sugerissem a argumentação da consciência independente do cérebro e sua possível sobrevivência após a morte (Laszlo, 2008).

Pesquisadores independentes relataram insucesso em tentar replicar estudos de transcomunicação de diversas formas (Baruæss, 2001). Estudos com design bem elaborado, utilizando metodologia adequada, tiveram resultados controversos (Boccuzzi e Beischel, 2011).

O tópico de estudo sofre com a escassez de publicações e a natural dificuldade metodológica de aplicação de critérios válidos para análise de resultados, como controle de interferências, reconhecimento de vozes e identificação das supostas entidades desencarnadas que se comunicam através de instrumentos.

2. Justificativa:

Desde o século XIX a literatura científica tem publicado artigos de revisão, descrição de casos e pesquisas de experiências sugestivas da possibilidade da autonomia da consciência em relação ao cérebro.

Ao longo das décadas, várias categorias de experiências foram descritas, em vários campos da Medicina, notadamente nas áreas de psiquiatria e neurologia.

O crescimento do número de publicações científicas em campos onde a possibilidade da autonomia da consciência em relação ao cérebro possa ser aventada, se não diretamente, mas através da especulação a partir dos relatos e dos resultados, justifica a necessidade de se conhecer um possível campo de pesquisas que englobe as variadas formas de experiências relacionadas à possibilidade da autonomia da consciência em relação ao cérebro. Esse campo, que se interrelaciona com as várias especialidades médicas e também com áreas das Ciências Sociais, como Psicologia, Antropologia, Ciências da Religião, reúne as experiências em Mediunidade, Experiências de Quase-Morte (EQM), Experiências no Final da Vida (EFV), Experiências fora do corpo (EFC), Memórias de Vidas Passadas (MVP, ou reencarnação), Possessão Espiritual, e outros, como Relação Mente-Cérebro, Transcomunicação Instrumental e Detecção de Espíritos (DE).

Bibliometria como campo de pesquisa teve crescimento expressivo nos últimos 20 anos (Thompson e Walker, 2015). Bibliometria representa, para as publicações científicas, o que a epidemiologia representa para os pacientes (Lewison e Devey, 1999). Em um campo que enfrenta conhecida resistência para publicação de pesquisas, todavia apresenta expressivo

crescimento (Cardeña, 2014), torna-se de importante necessidade um estudo bibliométrico que avalie as publicações na área, em todos os períodos da produção científica, nos principais bancos de dados.

Compreender os tipos de estudos, principais temas, desenhos metodológicos, principais autores, países e periódicos relacionados a essas pesquisas é de grande importância para se conhecer o estado da arte no campo, determinar possíveis lacunas de investigação e limitações metodológicas, o que auxiliará a traçar futuras direções para esse campo de pesquisa. Porém, não identificamos na literatura um estudo que tenha traçado um panorama dos principais artigos sobre o tema por meio da consulta dos principais bancos de artigos científicos, permitindo uma compreensão abrangente desse campo.

3. Objetivos:

O presente estudo objetiva fazer um levantamento bibliométrico das publicações que investigaram experiências habitualmente associadas à possibilidade da existência da autonomia da consciência em relação ao cérebro nas principais bases de dados científicos.

4. Métodos:

4.1. Tipo de estudo:

Para o presente estudo, conceituou-se bibliometria como a “análise quantitativa das características bibliográficas de um determinado campo da literatura” (Hawkins, 1977). A bibliometria baseia-se na utilização de dados bibliográficos dos artigos em análise (autores, títulos, ano, tipos de artigos, palavras-chave, dentre outros) (Carrizo-Sainero, 2000) e da influência de uma publicação (através de medidas específicas, como fator de impacto por exemplo) (Pinto e Andrade, 1999), para permitir o mapeamento da produção literária em um determinado campo e para determinar a estrutura de um campo de estudo (Estabrooks *et al.*, 2004) , podendo contribuir para destacar a relevância de uma disciplina na ciência (Similowski e Derenne, 1995).

4.2. Estratégia de Pesquisa:

Os termos gerais de pesquisa, ou termos-chave, foram estabelecidos a partir de uma revisão prévia sobre os principais subtemas da área e deliberou-se por consultar outros pesquisadores com experiência na área com o objetivo de confirmar a relevância dos termos-chave estabelecidos em identificar a maior parte dos estudos relevantes sobre o tema publicados na literatura científica.

Cada termo-chave correspondeu às diversas experiências e condições relatadas na literatura científica onde a autonomia da consciência em relação ao cérebro possa ser postulada pelas publicações por eles geradas em cada banco de dados escolhido.

Definiu-se como termos-chave principais: Mediunidade, Experiências de Quase-Morte, Experiências no Final da Vida, Experiências Fora do Corpo,

Memórias de Vidas Passadas, Fenômenos de Transe/Possessão, Detecção de Espíritos, Transcomunicação Instrumental, Relação Mente-Cérebro.

Utilizou a língua inglesa para os temas-chaves de pesquisa de cada área, que foram ampliados para resgatar o maior número possível de publicações nos bancos de dados da literatura científica e para isso foram divididos em subtemas distintos que estão apresentados na Tabela 1.

Para analisar os resultados da pesquisa, procedeu-se a análise de todos os resultados através leitura dos abstracts gerados, para classificação dos critérios de inclusão/exclusão.

4.3. Banco de dados científicos:

Para que a busca fosse abrangente (incluindo bases interdisciplinares e ligadas à medicina e psicologia, incluindo parapsicologia) e, ao mesmo tempo se restringisse a artigos publicados em periódicos científicos com reconhecimento acadêmico, foram selecionadas as seguintes bases de artigos científicos:

- Pubmed/MEDLINE (www.pubmed.org)
- Web of Knowledge (www.isi.com)
- SCOPUS (www.scopus.com)
- Science Direct (www.sciencedirect.com)
- PsycINFO (psycnet.apa.org).

Todos os artigos contidos nesses bancos até a data de 31 de dezembro de 2015, foram avaliados, através da utilização de operadores booleanos, definidos para cada termo-chave, no intuito de otimizar os resultados da pesquisa. Todos os termos-chave foram utilizados no idioma inglês e não se fez restrições quanto a revistas, autores, países e idiomas, desde que os *abstracts* gerados fossem escritos na língua inglesa.

4.4. Critérios de Inclusão:

Para ser incluído, o estudo deveria investigar ou discutir experiências habitualmente associadas à possibilidade da autonomia da consciência em relação ao cérebro (experiências de quase morte, experiências fora do corpo, mediunidade, fenômenos de transe/possessão, experiências no leito de morte, memórias sugestivas de vida passada e relação mente cérebro) e ser dos seguintes tipos: Artigos Originais, Artigos de Revisão, Comentários, Editoriais ou Notas, Cartas ao Editor ou Resenhas de livros.

Foram considerados como artigos originais todos os estudos que envolveram pesquisas de tipo epidemiológico prospectivo, ensaios clínicos, transversal, caso-controle, relato de caso ou série de casos.

Como artigos de revisão, foram incluídas revisões narrativas, revisões sistemáticas, meta-análises, descrições filosóficas sobre o tema selecionado.

Comentários, Editoriais e Notas foram agrupados como uma categoria. Apesar da devida distinção entre cada tipo de publicação, não apresenta relevância na hierarquia de evidências.

Cartas ao Editor e Resenhas de Livros foram destacados como categorias incluídas na análise por representarem, de certa forma, a repercussão que cada tópico gerou na comunidade científica de leitores das publicações e por sua relação com esse público.

4.5. Critérios de Exclusão:

Após a retirada dos artigos duplicados que se repetiam em mais de uma base, foram excluídos artigos científicos que não atendiam ao objetivo da pesquisa, artigos não científicos (publicação em revistas de divulgação científica, publicação em revistas não revisadas aos pares); livros ou capítulos de livros.

Apesar da utilização de termos-chave de pesquisas específicos, artigos científicos que não abordavam o tema pesquisado, foram excluídos.

Foram considerados artigos não-científicos aqueles publicados em revistas de divulgação científica e em revistas que não utilizam revisão aos pares. Para classificar como não-científico determinado artigo, pesquisou-se informações sobre a revista através de instrumentos de busca geral da internet.

Os livros ou capítulos de livro, quando não indicados na referência bibliográfica ou abstract gerado, foram confirmados através da utilização de pesquisa no Google Acadêmico (scholar.google.com).

4.6. Análise e Classificação das Referências:

Os termos-chave referentes a cada área foram pesquisados em todas as bases e os resultados gerados foram exportados para o Software *EndNote X7* com todas as informações disponíveis para cada citação. Para cada base de dados foi gerado um arquivo no software *EndNote X7*. Utilizando da opção *My Groups*, do Software *EndNote X7 for Mac*, foram criados grupos conforme os critérios de inclusão e exclusão, para cada termo-chave, de cada base de dados. Os abstracts foram analisados para a classificação de cada artigo e as referências que não geraram abstracts foram pesquisadas nas bases de dados citadas e também no Google Acadêmico (www.scholar.google.com), com o objetivo de encontrar dados que pudessem auxiliar na classificação dos mesmos. Os artigos foram classificados nas línguas inglesa e portuguesa em: Artigo Original (*Original Research -OR*), Artigo de Revisão (*Review Paper -R*), Editorial, Comentários e Notas (*Editorial, Comments, Notes (ED)*), Cartas ao Editor (*Letters -Lett*), Revisão de Livros (*Book Review -BR*),

Apresentações de Congressos (*Meeting Papers -Meet*), Fora do Tema (*Out of Interest*) e Não Científico (*Non scientific -NC*).

Em uma segunda etapa, todos os arquivos de cada base de dados, classificados pelos termos-chave de cada campo, foram reunidos em um único arquivo *EndNote* e avaliada a duplicidade de artigos.

Criou-se estilo de exportação personalizado, nomeado pelo autor como *Excel Export*, compreendendo os seguintes campos: Autor principal, ano de publicação, título da publicação, tipo de publicação, jornal de publicação, volume, fascículo, páginas, endereço do autor e idioma de publicação.

Finalmente, os dados foram exportados para o *Software Excel 2011 for Mac*, gerando uma planilha para cada termo-chave de pesquisa, e a utilização dos seguintes campos específicos em cada planilha: termo-chave, ano de publicação, autor principal, título, revista, páginas, fascículo, volume, endereço do autor, idioma e, quando disponível, base de dados. Todos os resultados foram novamente analisados quanto à duplicidade. Reuniu-se em planilha única todos os resultados para verificação de coincidência de resultados comuns entre termos de pesquisa e de áreas de pesquisa distintas.

Apenas para o processo de busca e inclusão ou exclusão dos artigos foi convidado um pesquisador independente, acadêmico de Medicina Rodolfo Damiano, que se associou ao autor e quando houve divergência de classificação, um terceiro pesquisador, Dr. Giancarlo Lucchetti (GL) fez a classificação final.

Para análise descritiva, foram avaliados em cada campo de pesquisa a produção dos principais autores de cada área, os tipos de artigos publicados,

número de artigos originais publicados a cada ano e o fator de impacto das revistas, baseados no *Journal of Citation Reports 2014* (2014 *Journal Citation Reports® Science Edition* (Thomson Reuters, 2015), 2015) e SCImago – “Cites per doc” (Scimago, 2016).

O Fator de Impacto médio das publicações em cada área e das publicações de todo o campo foi calculado utilizando-se o fator de impacto atual de cada publicação em circulação, através do *Journal of Citation Reports 2014*, multiplicado pelo número de artigos de cada publicação e dividido pelo total de artigos publicados em cada área.

As revistas que publicaram artigos em cada campo foram checadas segundo os dados fornecidos pelo catálogo da *National Library* (Home - PubMed - NCBI) com finalidade de se obter dados sobre seu status de publicação e classificadas como em circulação ou fora de circulação. As revistas não catalogadas pelo MEDLINE foram verificadas através do website de cada revista, quando disponível, para confirmação de seu status de circulação.


Os países do autor principal foram considerados como os indicados nos dados bibliográficas de cada referência. Quando essa informação não estava disponível, foi utilizada pesquisa através dos seguintes instrumentos: catálogo de autores da base *Web of Science* (<http://wcs.webofknowledge.com/SA/getSearchTerm.do;jsessionid=62D7E3244655E6E0F007066353FBF291?refineString=null&SID=2FdK6JY5sHM7CCFqGLz&product=UA&termName=AU&timeSpan=All+Years&returnURL=http%3a%2f%2fapps.webofknowledge.com%2fInboundService.do%3fproduct%20>) e o Google Acadêmico (<https://scholar.google.com>)

5. Resultados:

Os resultados dessa pesquisa foram descritos no artigo “*Research on experiences related to the possibility of consciousness beyond the brain: a bibliometric analysis of global scientific output*”, submetido a publicação em periódico indexado internacional, e que se encontra como apêndice (Apêndice A) da presente dissertação.

A busca realizada até 31 de dezembro de 2015 resultou em 9065 artigos (762 artigos no Pubmed/MEDLINE, 3006 artigos no Web of Knowledge, 2233 artigos no SCOPUS, 228 artigos no Science Direct e 1836 artigos no PsycINFO). Foram excluídos 3255 artigos duplicados e 3856 artigos por não preencherem os critérios de inclusão e exclusão, restando 1954 artigos (Apêndice B). Destes artigos, 598 eram relativos a Experiências de Quase-Morte (EQM), 223 Experiências Fora do Corpo (EFC), 56 Experiências no Final da Vida (EFV), 224 Transe e Possessão, 244 Memórias de Vidas Passadas (MVP), 565 Mediunidade, 3 Detecção de Espíritos (DE), 6 Transcomunicação Instrumental (TC) e 35 Relação Mente-Cérebro (RMC). A figura 1 detalha a estratégia de busca e os resultados obtidos:

Separando-se por subtemas, obtivemos os seguintes achados:

5.1. Mediunidade:

Foram geradas 943 referências sobre a área pesquisada e incluídas 565 (figura 1). A figura 2 descreve o número de publicações em mediunidade ao longo dos anos.

A tabela 2 descreve o panorama geral das publicações em mediunidade, com informações sobre os tipos epidemiológicos das publicações.

A análise deste campo de pesquisa permite descrever a percepção já citada de Stevenson (Stevenson, 1977b). Mais da metade dos artigos foram publicados até a década de 1980 (55.0%), havendo uma ressurgência na década de 2000 (31.3%). Houve um grande predomínio de revisões (52.4%) seguido de estudos com dados originais (28.7%), sendo sua maioria do tipo transversal (68.5%), um grande número de relatos de caso (31.4%). Destaca-se que nos últimos anos houve desenvolvimento de alguns protocolos chamados “triple-blinds” (triplo-cegos) com uma visão mais experimental.

Os cinco principais autores deste campo foram responsáveis por 11,1% dos artigos, incluindo revisões. Os principais autores deste campo foram: C. S. Alvarado (4,36%), J. B. Rhine (2,73%), A. Moreira-Almeida (2,00%), C. E. Stuart (1,09%), E. Haraldsson (1,09%), J. Beischel (1,09%).

A tabela 3 traz o panorama mais completo dos principais autores no campo ao longo de todos os anos pesquisados.

O número total de revistas que publicaram artigos no campo ao longo das décadas foi 142 e dessas 38 (26,8%) estão fora de circulação atualmente. A publicação em revistas sem classificação de fator de impacto JCR correspondeu a 26,9% seguidas das publicações com fator de impacto menor que 1.000 (35,6%). Pelo SCImago, o número de publicações em revistas sem

classificação de fator de impacto correspondeu a 14,4% e as publicações com fator de impacto menor que 1.000 corresponderam a 45,2%. O Fator de Impacto médio dessa área pelo JCR foi de 1.922.

As cinco principais revistas que publicaram artigos na área foram: “Journal of Parapsychology”, “Journal of American Society for Psychical Research”, “Journal of the Society for Psychical Research”, “Proceedings of the Society for Psychical Research”, “Journal of Scientific Exploration”.

A tabela 4 descreve as principais revistas que publicaram artigos no campo Mediunidade, de todos os tipos epidemiológicos.

Os cinco principais países que publicaram artigos originais e de revisão no campo Mediunidade foram: EUA(53,46%), Reino Unido (22,35%), Brasil (5,99%), Alemanha(4,15%), Itália (1,84%).

A tabela 5 descreve os principais países em publicações de pesquisas originais e artigos de revisão no campo Mediunidade.

Com a finalidade de compreender melhor o campo, uma vez que os termos de pesquisa utilizados incluíram o termo Percepção Extra-Sensorial (*Extra-Sensorial Perception*) que gera artigos relacionados a Telepatia, optou-se, para possibilitar maior compreensão do campo, pela exclusão dos artigos gerados pela utilização deste termo de pesquisa (*Extra-Sensorial Perception*). A tabela 6 apresenta o panorama do campo Mediunidade após a exclusão de artigos que tratavam especificamente de Percepção Extra-Sensorial mas não tratavam de Mediunidade. A figura 3 apresenta o panorama das publicações ao longo dos anos no campo Mediunidade, excluídos os artigos referentes a Telepatia, capturados pela inclusão do termo Percepção Extra-Sensorial, no termo-chave de pesquisa Mediunidade.

Figura 2: Publicações ao longo dos anos Campo Mediunidade





5.2. Experiências de Quase-Morte (EQM):

No presente estudo, foram analisados 908 artigos gerados pelos termos-chave relacionados com EQM e incluídos 598 artigos. A figura 4 descreve as publicações em EQM ao longo dos anos.

A tabela 7 descreve o panorama das pesquisas em EQM ao longo das décadas. Com a utilização dos termos-chave escolhidos para o campo, as referências iniciais foram registradas a partir do ano de 1976, seguindo o livro de Raymond Moody “Life after Life” que data de 1975. As publicações de trabalhos originais sobre EQM na literatura científica foram regulares ao longo das décadas. Houve um predomínio de revisões (33.4%) seguido de estudos originais (27.5%), sendo sua maioria do tipo transversal (73.9%), com pequeno número de pesquisas prospectivas em relação ao número de artigos publicados (3.6%).

Os 5 principais autores na área representam 14,6% do total dos autores da área. Os principais autores na área foram: B. Greyson (7,33%), W. J. Serdahely (2,39%), M. B. Sabom (1,87%), K. Ring (1,53%), M. L. Morse (1,53%).

Os autores que mais publicaram na área EQM estão listados na tabela 8.

Os artigos do campo foram publicados em 177 revistas ao longo das décadas e todas elas ainda estão em circulação. O número de publicações em revistas que não são classificadas pelo Journal of Citation Reports correspondeu a 41,8% do total e 17.5% dos artigos do campo foram publicadas em revistas com fator de impacto superior a 3.000. Pelo SCImago, artigos publicados em revistas sem classificação de fator de impacto que publicaram no campo corresponderam a 15,8% e aqueles em revistas com

fator de impacto superior a 3.000 foram 17,5% do total. O Fator de Impacto médio dessa área pelo JCR foi de 3.094.

As cinco revistas que mais publicaram referências na área foram: “Journal of Near-Death Studies”, “The Lancet”, “Journal of The American Society of Psychical Research”, “Omega – Journal of Death and Dying” e “Journal of Nervous and Mental Disease”.

A tabela 9 lista as principais revistas que publicaram artigos sobre EQM.

Os principais países que publicaram artigos originais e de revisão no campo EQM foram: EUA(66%), Reino Unido (9,6%), Austrália (5,8%), Alemanha (3,6%), Itália (1,9%), Holanda (1,9%).

A tabela 10 lista os países que mais publicaram pesquisas originais e artigos de revisão no campo EQM.

Figura 4: Publicações por ano campo Experiências de Quase Morte (EQM):



5.3. Experiências no Final da Vida (EFV):

Foram geradas 2196 referências e, após aplicação dos critérios de inclusão e exclusão, foram incluídas 56 referências. (Figura 1).

A tabela 11 descreve o panorama das pesquisas em Experiências no Final da Vida ao longo das décadas. A grande maioria dos artigos do campo foram publicados a partir da década de 2000 (85.7%). O número de estudos originais correspondeu a 42,8% (estudos transversais 70,8%, relatos de caso 20,8%, prospectivos 8,3%) e o número de revisões correspondeu a 37,5%.

A frequência de publicação dos cinco principais autores na área representou 31,9% do total dos autores da área. Os cinco principais autores na área foram: M. Nahm (7,14%), P. Fenwick (7,14%), A. Kellehear (5,36%), S. Brayne (5,36%), I. B. Corless (3,57%).

A tabela 12 lista os principais autores que publicaram no campo EFV.

O número de revistas que publicou artigos do campo ao longo das décadas foi 23 e não foram publicados artigos em revistas que não estão em circulação atualmente. Das revistas que publicaram artigos no campo, 30,4% não foram classificadas com fator de impacto pelo JCR; 26,1% foram publicados em revistas com fator de impacto menor que 1.000, 30,4% em revistas classificadas com fator de impacto entre 1.000 e 3.000 e 13% em revistas com fator de impacto maior que 3.000. Pelo SCImago, o número de publicações em revistas sem classificação de fator de impacto correspondeu a 8,7%; revistas com classificação menor que 1.000 e entre 1.000 e 3.000 tiveram correspondência equivalente em a 43,48% e apenas 4,35% das revistas foram classificadas com fator de impacto maior que 3.000. O Fator de Impacto médio dessa área pelo JCR foi de 1.213.

A figura 5 representa as publicações ao longo dos anos no campo EFV.

As principais revistas que publicaram artigos da área foram: “American Journal of Hospice & Palliative Medicine”, “Omega: Journal of Death and Dying”, “Journal of Near-Death Studies” e “Archives of Geriatrics and Gerontology”.

A tabela 13 descreve as principais revistas que publicaram artigos no campo EFV.

Os cinco principais países que publicaram artigos originais e de revisão no campo Experiências no Final da Vida foram: EUA (42,22%), Reino Unido (26,67%), Alemanha (8,89%), Austrália, Canadá (4,44%). e Suíça (4,44%).

A tabela 14 descreve os países com publicações de pesquisas originais e artigos de revisão, no campo EFV.

Figura 5: Publicações ao longo dos anos campo Experiências no Final da Vida (EFV):



5.4. Experiências Fora do Corpo (EFC):

Foram geradas 887 referências na pesquisa do campo EFC e incluídos 272 artigos. Por ser um dos componentes da EQM, houve ocorrência de 49 artigos referentes a EQM e, após exclusão, foram analisados 223 artigos (Figura 1).

A tabela 15 descreve o panorama das pesquisas em EFC ao longo das décadas. A primeira referência no campo EFC foi registrada no ano de 1938 e houve um crescente nas publicações de artigos, com maior expressão nos últimos 15 anos. As revisões corresponderam a 34,5% e os estudos originais a 30,4% e maioria de tais estudos foram do tipo transversal (95,5%).

A figura 6 demonstra ao volume das publicações no campo EFC ao longo das décadas.

Os 5 principais autores deste campo foram responsáveis por 21,2% dos artigos, incluindo revisões. Os principais autores na área foram: C. S. Alvarado (7,83%), H. J. Irwin (4,15%), S. J. Blackmore (3,69%), C. T. Tart (2,30%), P. Brugger (2,30%).

Os principais autores no campo EFC estão listados na tabela 16.

Ao longo das décadas, os artigos no tema foram publicados em 96 revistas, das quais 12 (12,5%) estão atualmente fora de circulação. As publicações do campo em revistas sem fator de impacto pelo JCR corresponderam a 40,6%, e houve equilíbrio entre publicações com fator de impacto entre 1,01 e 3,0 (22,9%) e em publicações com fator de impacto superior a 3,000 (22,9%). Pelo SCImago, as revistas sem classificação de fator de impacto corresponderam a 10,7% e houve equilíbrio entre as revistas

classificadas com fator de impacto entre 1.001 (27.3%) e 3.000 e maior que 3.000 (27.3%). O Fator de Impacto médio dessa área pelo JCR foi de 3.701.

As principais revistas que publicaram artigos sobre EFC foram: “Journal of The American Society for Psychical Research”, “Journal of Parapsychology”, “Journal of Near Death Studies”, “Journal of the Society of Psychical Research”, “Journal of Nervous and Mental Disease”.

A tabela 17 descreve as principais revistas no campo EFC.

Os principais países que publicaram artigos originais e de revisão no campo EFC foram: EUA (38,06%), Reino Unido (19,4%), Austrália (10,45%), Alemanha (8,2%), Suíça (7,46%).

Figura 6: Publicações ao longo dos anos no campo Experiências Fora do Corpo (EFC):



5.5. Memórias de Vidas Passadas (MVP ou Reencarnação):

Foram geradas 945 referências na área pesquisada que, após aplicação dos critérios de inclusão, geraram 244 publicações para análise (Figura 1).

O campo apresentou uniformidade de publicações nas duas últimas décadas do século XX, apresentando um aumento de 40% na década 2000.

A figura 7 representa as publicações ao longo dos anos no campo MVP.

A tabela 19 descreve o panorama das pesquisas em Memórias de Vidas Passadas ao longo das décadas. A publicação de estudos originais correspondeu a 33.6% e o de revisões correspondeu a 30,3%. A maioria dos estudos com dados originais foi do tipo transversal (65.8%), seguido por relatos de caso (28.0%).

Os cinco principais autores do campo foram responsáveis por 25.8% das publicações analisadas. Os principais autores na área foram: I. Stevenson (11,93%), E. Haraldsson (4,94%), S. Pasricha (4,12%), A. Mills (2,06%), J. B. Tucker (2,06%).

Os autores mais destacados do campo MVP estão listados na tabela 20.

O número total de revistas que publicaram artigos no campo ao longo das décadas foi de 99 revistas e destas, 17 (17,17%) estão fora de circulação atualmente. A publicação em revistas sem classificação pelo fator de impacto JCR correspondeu a 39%. As publicações com fator de impacto menor que 1.000 e menor que 3.000 corresponderam a 44% do total. Pelo SCImago, 17% dos artigos foram publicados em revistas sem classificação de fator de impacto e 47,6% das revistas foram classificadas com fator de impacto menor que 1.000. O Fator de Impacto médio dessa área pelo JCR foi de 1.971.

As principais revistas que publicaram artigos na área foram: “Journal of American Society for Psychical Research”, “Journal of Scientific Exploration”, “Journal of Nervous and Mental Disease”, “Journal of Parapsychology”, “Journal of the Society for Psychical Research”.

As revistas mais importantes no campo MVP estão listadas na tabela 21.

Os países que mais publicaram artigos originais e de revisão no campo Memórias de Vidas Passadas foram: EUA(50,64%), Índia (8,33%), Islândia (6,41%), Austrália (5,77%), Reino Unido (5,77%).

Os principais países com publicações de artigos originais e de revisão, no campo MVP, estão listados na tabela 22.

Figura 7: Publicações ao longo dos anos no campo Memórias de Vidas Passadas (MVP):



5.6. Transe e Possessão Espiritual:

Foram geradas 1310 referências na pesquisa do campo de Transe e Possessão e após a aplicação dos critérios de inclusão, foram analisados 224 artigos (figura 1).

A tabela 23 descreve o panorama geral das pesquisas em Transtornos de Transe e Possessão ao longo das décadas. O número de publicações apresentou pequeno crescimento a partir da década de 1980. Dos artigos selecionados pelos termos-chave utilizados, houve predomínio de revisões (59.5%) seguido de estudos originais (25.3%), estudos transversais (52.6%), relatos de caso (34.6%).

Os cinco principais autores deste campo foram responsáveis por 8.7% dos artigos, incluindo revisões. Os principais autores da área foram: E. Somer (2,23%), A. Moreira-Almeida (1,79%), B.-Y. Ng (1,34%), M. van Duijl (1,34%), R. J. Castillo (1,34%).

Os principais autores do campo Possessão estão listados na tabela 24.

Ao longo das décadas, o número de revistas que publicou artigos do campo foi de 100 revistas e todas elas encontram-se atualmente em circulação. As revistas sem classificação pelo JCR corresponderam a 35%, sendo que 31% das publicações estavam em revistas com impacto entre 1.000 a 3.000. Pelo SCImago, as revistas sem classificação de fator de impacto corresponderam a 9% e 46% foram publicados em revistas com fator de impacto menor que 1.000. O Fator de Impacto médio dessa área pelo JCR foi de 1.728.

A figura 8 representa as publicações ao longo dos anos no campo Possessão.

As revistas que mais publicaram artigos nesse campo foram: “Social Science Medicine”, “Culture, Medicine and Psychiatry”, “Australian and New Zealand Journal of Psychiatry”, “Transcultural Psychiatry”, “Anthropology and Medicine”.

A tabela 25 descreve detalhadamente as principais revistas que publicaram artigos no campo Possessão.

Os principais países que publicaram artigos originais e de revisão no campo Possessão Espiritual foram: EUA (28,72%), Reino Unido (10,26%), Alemanha (6,15%), Canadá (5,13%), Brasil (4,62%).

Figura 8: Publicações ao longo dos anos no campo Possessão



5.7. Relação Mente-Cérebro, Transcomunicação, Detecção de Espíritos:

O campo Relação Mente-Cérebro descreve referências cujos termos-chave não foram apropriadamente contemplados nas outras áreas pesquisadas. Foram geradas 124 referências e incluídas 36 referências.

Transcomunicação Instrumental e Detecção de Espíritos formam dois campos com pequeno número de resultados. Detecção de Espíritos gerou apenas 3 referências e Transcomunicação Instrumental gerou 5 artigos. 84,78% dos artigos dos campos foram publicados após a década de 2001.

A tabela 27 descreve o panorama geral desses campos agrupados (RMC, TC, DE).


Os artigos foram publicados em 31 revistas. Destas, 16 (51,61%) não tinham avaliação do fator de impacto, 7 (22,58%) foram classificadas com fator de impacto entre 0.000 e 1.000, 3 (9,68%) foram classificadas com fator de impacto entre 1.001 e 3.00 e 5 (16,13%) revistas foram classificadas com fator de impacto maior que 3.000. O Fator de Impacto médio dessa área pelo JCR foi de 3.505.

5.8. Campos Sobrepostos:

Foram analisados campos sobrepostos, definidos como artigos que utilizaram termos de pesquisa comuns a mais de um campo. Após depuração através de revisão dos artigos gerados em cada campo encontrou-se: 39 artigos que utilizaram termos de pesquisa de mais de um campo de pesquisa, 16 artigos que utilizaram termos de pesquisa de Mediunidade e Possessão Espiritual, 13 artigos que utilizaram termos de pesquisa de EQM e EFC, 5 artigos que utilizaram termos de pesquisa de Mediunidade e Memórias de Vidas Passadas, 3 artigos que utilizaram termos de pesquisa de Mediunidade e Relação Mente-Cérebro, 1 artigo que utilizou termos de pesquisa de EQM e EFV e 1 artigo que utilizou termos de pesquisa de EQM e Reencarnação.

6. Discussão:

Ao longo das décadas, notou-se um aumento na quantidade de artigos em todos os campos avaliados, com exceção dos estudos em Mediunidade, no qual houve um declínio no final do século XX e uma retomada no século XXI. Em relação aos tipos de artigos, com exceção de Memórias de Vidas Passadas e Experiências no Final da Vida (predominando estudos originais), os demais campos possuem predomínio de artigos de revisão. A maioria dos artigos foram publicados em periódicos com fator de impacto entre 0 e 3.

O aumento nas últimas décadas da quantidade de artigos que abordaram experiências que potencialmente podem sugerir a autonomia da consciência está em linha com uma tendência mundial, em que houve um grande aumento na disponibilidade de revistas científicas, aumento de programas de pós graduação e a facilidade de buscas e envios de artigos via internet (Wren, 2005). Encontramos um crescimento geral da produção da investigação de autonomia da consciência de 148% nos períodos de 2009-2013 em relação a 2004-2008. Comparando-se com outras áreas que foram analisadas em um estudo prévio(Lucchetti e Lucchetti, 2014), percebe-se que o crescimento foi compatível, por exemplo, a área de diabetes (140-143%), menor que as áreas de Medicina Integrativa (186-201%) e meditação (196-216%) e maior que outras áreas como “saúde e espiritualidade” (121-126%), Psicossomática (82-122%) e Homeopatia (90%).

Além do crescimento numérico de artigos, é importante investigar o perfil dos periódicos onde foram publicados, notadamente o fator de impacto das revistas. As médias de fatores de impacto dos diferentes temas investigados variaram entre 1.21 a 3.70, sendo que a média geral foi de 2.47, o que é

comparável ao de diversas outras áreas. No campo de reabilitação em doenças cérebro e cardiovasculares a média do fator de impacto (JCR) foi de 1,56 (Ugolini *et al.*, 2013) e na Psicologia Positiva foi de 2,64 (Rusk e Waters, 2013). Entre 60% a 70% dos artigos incluídos em nosso estudo foram publicados em revistas que possuíam indexação no JCR, resultado semelhante ao encontrado na área de reabilitação oncológica, em que 66,7% das revistas eram indexadas no JCR (Ugolini *et al.*, 2012), reforçando a semelhança do padrão de publicação com outras áreas.

Considerando os temas de pesquisa investigados neste artigo, temas muitas vezes considerados marginais e que poderiam gerar relutância de editores em publicá-los (Beauregard *et al.*, 2014), é digno de nota o número considerável de publicações encontradas (quase 2000 no total), com um crescimento e um fator de impacto médio similar a outras áreas acadêmicas. Concordamos com os autores que ponderaram que o fator de impacto das revistas não reflete totalmente a qualidade dos artigos publicados (Seglen, 1997). Entretanto, a medida do quanto uma revista é citada em média nos fornece um bom indicador do impacto e do prestígio do periódico no meio acadêmico, sendo esse um critério muito utilizado na ciencitometria atual.

Nossos dados apontam ainda para um número expressivo de artigos de revisões (30% a 60% dependendo da área) e relatos de casos (20% a 30% dependendo da área). Ao investigar uma área ampla que abrange tópicos diversos, várias metodologias de pesquisa e diversidade de sujeitos estudados caracterizam o campo. Poucos estudos considerados como de forte evidência, tais como estudos prospectivos, foram encontrados, revelando não apenas as já conhecidas dificuldades metodológicas da área,

bem como possível carência de protocolos mais rigorosos e estudos mais robustos.

Os tópicos Mediunidade e Possessão apresentaram forte predomínio de artigos de revisão, possivelmente por tratarem-se de tópicos em que naturalmente se discute a natureza da consciência (mente) (Moreira-Almeida, 2012). Entretanto, esse predomínio de revisões é também percebido em outras áreas afins como no campo da Psicologia Social (40% a 60% de revisões) (Leeuwen, 2013), porém é diferente de outras áreas mais biológicas ou biomédicas como nutrição oncológica (23.5%) (Kotepui *et al.*, 2013), gastroenterologia (17.2%) (Chou, 2009) ou ainda medicina preventiva (7%) (Franks *et al.*, 2006).

No intuito de uma maior compreensão de cada campo e suas respectivas lacunas, optou-se por discutir cada área de forma individualizada. O campo EQM foi o que gerou mais artigos específicos e o que em números absolutos gerou maior número de estudos transversais e longitudinais. Esse é um campo que, apesar de recente, mostra maior consolidação científica e estudos prospectivos, impulsionados por pesquisas relacionadas a cardiologia e medicina intensiva e forte apelo midiático (Choi, 2011; Morelle, 2013).

O campo EFC apresenta artigos em comum com o campo EQM, por poder ser componente das EQM, mas também tem sido estudado como ocorrência espontânea (Blackmore, S. J., 1986), como experiência passível de ser induzida quer por drogas (Wilkins *et al.*, 2012) ou por outros meios (Ehrsson, 2007), como fenômeno paranormal (Alvarado, 1989), como fenômeno de ocorrência em situações extremas (Alvarado, 2001), em

condições psiquiátricas (Blackmore, S., 1986) e em epilepsia (Greyson *et al.*, 2014). Pela multiplicidade de estudos em várias áreas, pode-se concluir que o campo apresenta razoável número de estudos que não tem por objetivo avaliar a possibilidade da autonomia da consciência em relação ao cérebro.

O campo Possessão incluiu número grande de artigos investigativos de transtornos mentais e muitas investigação antropológicas e eminentemente descritivas que na maioria das vezes, apesar de investigarem experiências associadas, não investigam propriamente a questão da sobrevivência da consciência. Esse campo é tópico complexo. A partir do DSM-IIIR houve esforço para se estabelecer as categorias diagnósticas dos transtornos dissociativos (Spiegel e Cardena, 1991), porém o fenômeno transepossessão está presente em várias culturas e manifestações religiosas, sem que geralmente haja transtorno mental (Moreira-Almeida *et al.*, 2007; Moreira-Almeida, Alexander *et al.*, 2008; Menezes Júnior e Moreira-Almeida, 2009).

Em relação ao campo Mediunidade, encontramos um grande número de relatos de casos com médiuns, analisando manifestações diversas, como veracidade de informações ou aspectos neurofisiológicos. Nesse campo, incluiu-se também estudos de laboratório sobre percepção extra-sensorial e sobre telepatia, que são áreas que conceitualmente apresentam hipóteses alternativas à mediunidade e demonstram abordagens metodológicas distintas.

Após a década de 2001, a investigação de médiuns adotou critérios metodológicos mais rigorosos, com resultados ainda não completamente aceitos. Uma mudança de paradigma tem surgido nos últimos anos com o

desenvolvimento de protocolos experimentais triplo-cegos (French, 2001; Amatuzzi *et al.*, 2003), que respeitariam de forma mais rigorosa os desenhos científicos atuais.

O campo Memórias de Vidas Passadas gerou número significativo de estudos transversais. Esse campo se caracteriza predominantemente por resultados obtidos pelo relato dos participantes da pesquisa e a análise de sua possível veracidade. Essa particularidade metodológica para esse tipo de pesquisa é corroborada por algumas publicações (Almeida e Lotufo Neto, 2003; Chibeni e Moreira-Almeida, 2007). Há também um amplo debate sobre o quanto fantasia, falsas memórias e hipnose explicariam esses casos (Schouten e Stevenson, 1998; Meyersburg *et al.*, 2009; Lucchetti, G. *et al.*, 2013).

O campo Experiências do Final da Vida, apesar de ser um campo recente e com menor número de artigos, foi o campo de maior crescimento na última década em nosso levantamento, provavelmente impulsionado pelo crescimento das pesquisas em cuidados paliativos e espiritualidade (Lucchetti e Lucchetti, 2014; Richardson, 2014), todavia o fator de Impacto médio dessa área foi inferior ao das outras áreas que compõem o campo amplo que denominamos Autonomia da Consciência em Relação ao Cérebro.

7. Limitações:

Algumas limitações podem ser destacadas nesta pesquisa. Primeiro, trata-se de uma avaliação de estudos indexados em bancos importantes de artigos científicos, o que resulta na exclusão de artigos em outros bancos ou ainda na exclusão de estudos que tenham sido publicados anteriormente a essa indexação, por exemplo artigos do século XIX, período em que muitos pesquisadores de destaque se dedicaram a pesquisas sobre sobrevivência da consciência. Segundo, foram excluídos livros e teses. Apesar da importância que esses estudos têm e tiveram na ciência como um todo, optamos pela exclusão dos mesmos no intuito de analisar apenas o que tem sido publicado no formato de artigos científicos, obedecendo a tendência de outras análises bibliométricas. Terceiro, apesar da abrangência de termos utilizada, provavelmente há artigos dessas áreas que não possuem nenhum dos termos-chave utilizados e não foram incluídos.

Apesar dessas limitações, o presente estudo permite aos pesquisadores da área compreenderem melhor o que tem sido publicado, a tendência de crescimento ou não do número de artigos, as principais lacunas no que diz respeito a metodologia e as revistas que mais se interessam pela temática na atualidade.

8. Conclusão:

Em conclusão, de forma geral, as pesquisas sobre autonomia da consciência em relação ao cérebro têm aumentado nas últimas décadas, em revistas com fator de impacto semelhante ao de outras áreas, porém com predomínio de revisões. A identificação dessas lacunas pode auxiliar na elaboração de novas pesquisas na área.
